Beware of stray animals and wildlife (raccoons, skunks, woodchucks, foxes, etc) that appear aggressive, unnaturally friendly or appear to be sick!!!

Rabies is a fatal viral disease carried in mammals.

People get rabies from a rabid animal's bite or contaminated saliva on skin that is scratched or cut.

If your animal may have come into contact with a raccoon or skunk, contact the Englewood Health Department immediately.

Wild & stray animals can be dangerous even if they look friendly.  
**DO NOT FEED THEM!!**

NEVER touch wild or stray animals, either dead or alive.

Vaccinate all pets against rabies - cats and dogs.

If bitten or scratched by an animal consult your doctor and report to the Englewood Health Department.
